



At 12 NOON, the Offertory Antiphon is sung to a polyphonic setting by Orlando di Lasso (1532-1594).







To receive Holy Communion in the hand, please use the Communion line in the center aisle of the Nave.





MUSIC NOTES

Orlando di Lasso was born in Mons, in Hainaut, in what is now part of Belgium. He spent his early years as a chorister in the service of Ferrante Gonzaga, a Mantuan general under Charles V, and from 1553-1555 was *maestro di cappella* of the Roman Basilica of St. John Lateran, succeeding Giovanni Francesco Animuccia and was himself succeeded by Palestrina.

In 1556, Lasso was part of a contingent of Netherlandish singers invited by Duke Albrecht V of Bavaria to revitalize his court chapel choir in Munich. Named *Kapellmeister* in 1563, Lasso remained in Munich until his death when he was succeeded in turn by his two sons Ferdinand and Rudolph, who published in 1604 a (nearly) complete edition of their father's works, entitled *Magnum opus musicum*.

With an extant legacy of over 2,000 works in all Latin, French, Italian, and German vocal genres of the time, including 60 Mass settings, 100 Magnificats, and 500 motets, Lasso is by some distance the most prolific composer of the Renaissance. He was also the most acclaimed, known in his time as *princeps musicorum* and 'le divin Orlande,' and he took on many students including Andrea and possibly Giovanni Gabrieli. In 1570 Emperor Maximilian II conferred nobility upon him and Pope Gregory XIII knighted him.
